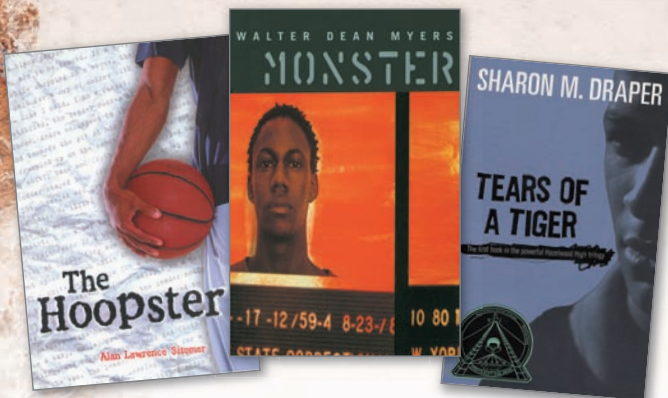

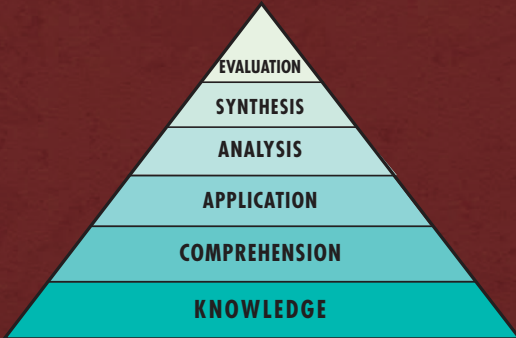

THE SIX-STEP RECIPE FOR NAILING THE STANDARDS

The following process guides each of the core literary elements taught in the BookJams:

STEP 1: CITE the Core Language Arts Standard

STEP 2: DEFINE the Key Literary Term

STEP 3: EXEMPLIFY the Standard

STEP 4: GAUGE the Standard

STEP 5: NAIL the Standard

STEP 6: EXTEND, STRETCH, BUILD, AND ADVANCE the Standard
